Number of items taken for scoring: 39 Number of items dropped: 01 (Question no. 39)

In Q.39, there was an incomplete Hindi translation of the question. Also some explanations have been provided for the students who have raised doubts.

In Q.23) There were doubts raised with respect to Assumption made in Statement 3 of the Question that "Food inflation in India is largely import driven".

Explanation- The instruction provided for the passages is "Your answers to these items should be based on the passages only."

Now, According to the given passage-

Natural gas is a raw material for urea (fertilizer).

India imports large quantities of LNG.

Meaning, Higher LNG prices - Higher fertilizer prices - Higher food prices.

The only reason for food inflation mentioned in the passage is LNG imports. Since we are to answer based on the passage, it does suggest that food inflation is driven by imported LNG prices. All other factors affecting the price of LNG/ Fertilizers/Food prices are outside the scope of passage. Hence Statement 3 is a correct assumption.
