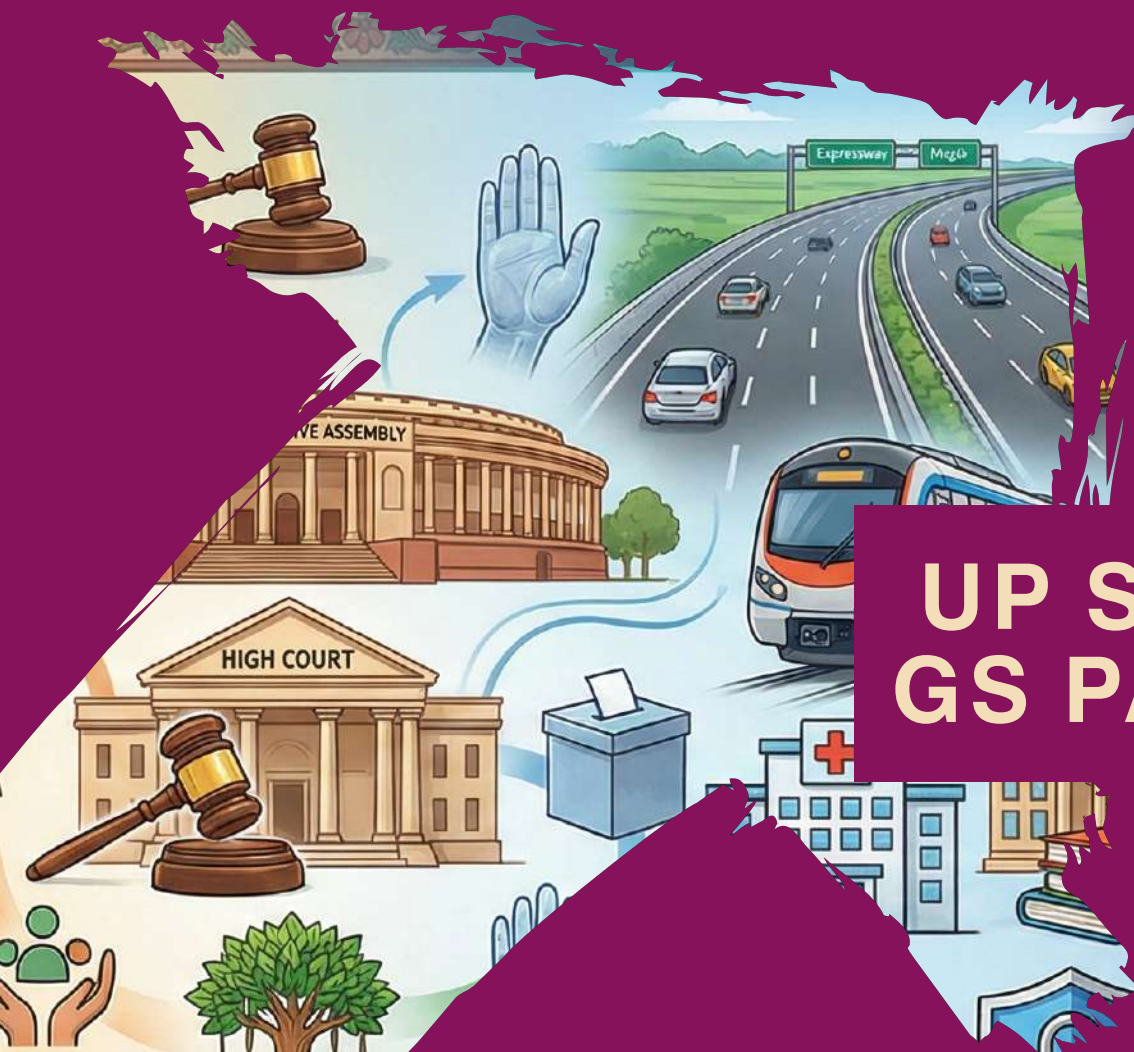

HISTORICAL & GEO-CULTURAL SIGNIFICANCE



Uttar Pradesh

Gangetic Plain (Alluvial)




Vindhyan Region (Hills)

Cradle of Gangetic Civilization: Unique continuous archaeological sequence (e.g., Belan Valley).


Vindhyan Geo-Cultural Link: Acts as a bridge between Peninsular stone age traditions and Gangetic settlements.

PALEOLITHIC PERIOD (OLD STONE AGE)

Core Characteristic: Hunter-gatherers, use of Quartzite tools (Hand axes, Cleavers).

Belan Valley	Prayagraj	Unique Feature: Evidence of all three phases (Paleolithic, Mesolithic, Neolithic) in sequence. Artifact: Bone statue of Mother Goddess (Lohanda Nala). 
Singrauli Basin	Sonbhadra	Rich deposition of stone tools; rock shelters.
Chakia	Chandauli	Pebble tools and flake tools found.

MESOLITHIC PERIOD (MIDDLE STONE AGE)

Transition: Shift to small game, beginning of domestication, Microliths.




Revolution: Agriculture, pottery, settled village life.

Nomadic Life Agriculture (Rice) + Domestication Food Surplus Pottery (Storage)

Site	Location	Significance
Koldihwa	Belan Valley (Prayagraj)	• Rice Cultivation: Evidence of domesticated rice (<i>Oryza sativa</i>) dated to ~6500 BC. • Earliest evidence of rice in the world (debated). 
Mahagara	Prayagraj	• Evidence of Cattle Pen (Animal husbandry). • Cord-impressed pottery. 
Lahuradewa	Sant Kabir Nagar	• Game Changer: Recent radiocarbon dating puts rice cultivation here at 9000 BC - 7000 BC. • Oldest agricultural site in the Indian Subcontinent (Supersedes Mehgarh).

CURRENT AFFAIRS LINKAGE & POLICY NOTE

- Sanauli Excavation (Baghpat):** Recent ASI findings ("Sacred Chambers", "Chariots") link Gangetic plain to advanced warrior classes, reshaping Vedic vs. Harappan timeline.
- Paleolithic Findings in Jalaun (2023):** Discovery of bone fossils and stone tools in Pahuj river bed suggests earlier human existence.
- Geo-Heritage Sites & Tourism:** Sonbhadra Fossil Park (Salkhan) for UNESCO tag. UP Govt creates **Bundelkhand & Vindhya Circuit** linking Kalinjar, Chitrakoot, Sonbhadra to promote rock art tourism (Lekhahia, Morhana Pahar).

Exploration of Cultural Shifts, Continuity, and Key Discoveries



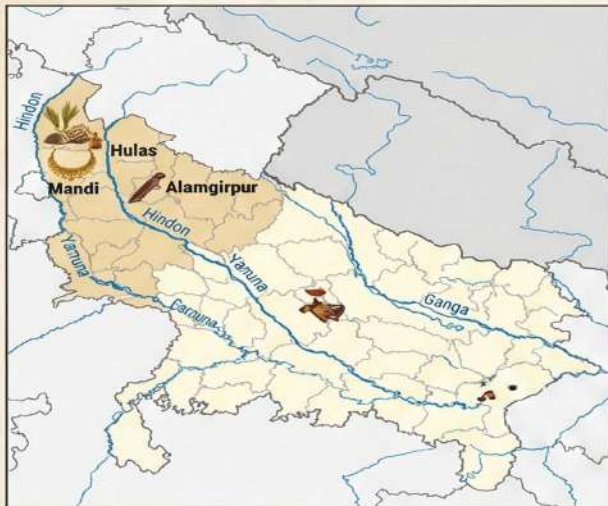
HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE & CULTURAL SHIFT

- **Cultural Shift:** Power transition from Sapta-Sindhu (Indus) to Ganga-Yamuna Doab (Madhyadesha).
- **Continuity:** Sanauli findings suggest indigenous evolution from Bronze Age (OCP) to Iron Age (PGW/Vedic), challenging the "Dark Age" theory between Harappan and Vedic periods.



INDUS VALLEY CIVILIZATION (IVC) IN UP

Nature & Geography: Predominantly Late Harappan/Eastern Hinterland. Mix of urban & rural agrarian traits. Concentrated in Upper Doab region.

Location: Yamuna-Hindon Doab

Culture: Ochre Coloured Pottery (OCP)

Status: Major archaeological discovery by Dr. S.K. Manjul, ASI.

VEDIC ERA IN UTTAR PRADESH: GEOGRAPHICAL SHIFT & CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT

A. EXPANSION OF ARYANS & POTTERY MARKER

- **Geographical Shift:** Center of gravity moved to Madhyadesha (Central Country).
- **Pottery Marker:** PGW archaeologically identified with Vedic (Later Vedic) period.

EARLY VEDIC

Limited presence (fringes of Western UP).

LATER VEDIC (1000-600 BC)

Full colonization of the Gangetic Plain.

- **Deforestation:** Use of fire (Satapatha Brahmana - Legend of Videha Madhava) & Iron axes to clear Doab forests.

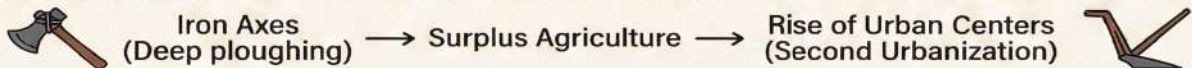

3	Kashi	Varanasi	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Earliest seat of Aryan education and Vedic learning.
4	Kosala	Ayodhya, Faizabad	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Associated with the Ramayana.

C. THE IRON REVOLUTION (KRISHNA-AYAS)

Atranjikhera (Etah): First major evidence of Iron usage in Upper Gangetic plain (~1000 BC).



5. CURRENT AFFAIRS LINKAGE



Lakshagriha (Barnawa) Verdict (2024): Context: ASI excavation at Barnawa (Baghpat) identified as Mahabharata-era "Lakshagriha".

Update: Local court ruled in favor of the site being a historic monument, linked to Mahabharata, rejecting Sufi shrine claims.

Linkage: Validates PGW culture overlap with Epic literature.



Sanauli "National Importance" Tag: ASI in process of declaring Sanauli a "Site of National Importance". Proposals for "Bronze Age Museum" in Baghpat.



Hastinapur Excavation Project: New funding for stratigraphy to scientifically date the Mahabharata period (Project Mausam).

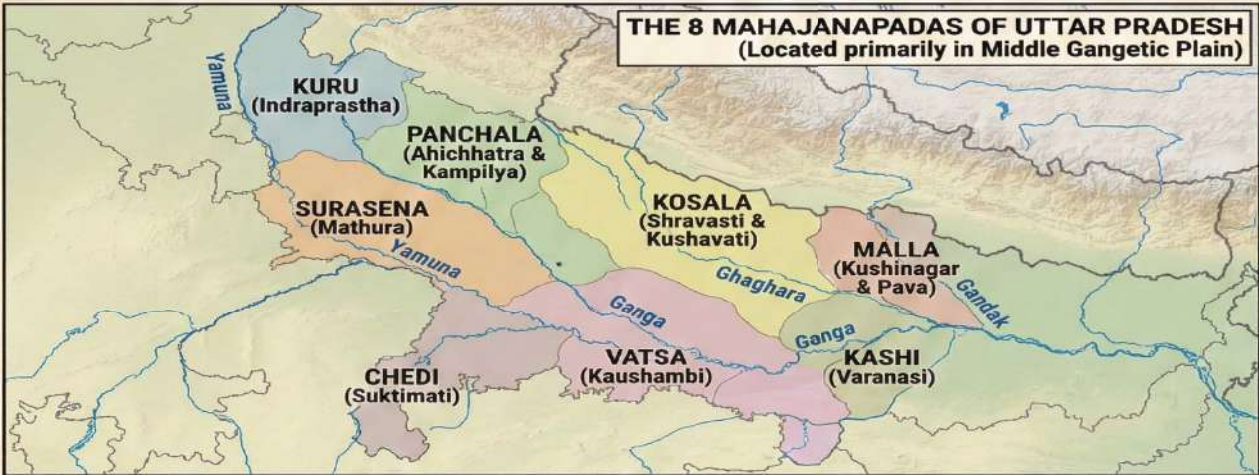

POLITICAL CENTER:
 "Heartland of the Second Urbanization"

 Uttar Pradesh hosted 8 out of 16 Mahajanapadas (Anguttara Nikaya). Political axis shifted from Indus to Ganga-Yamuna Doab.

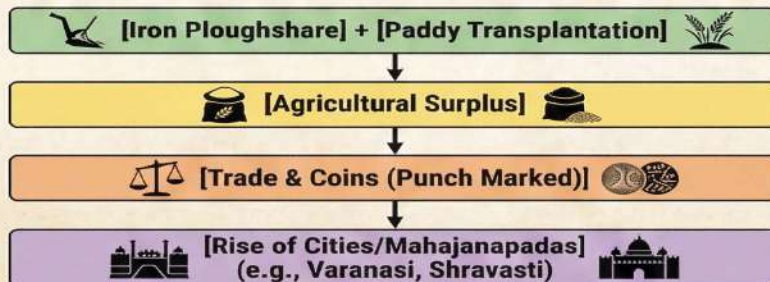
CULTURAL CRUCIBLE:
 "Cradle of Buddhism & Jainism"

 Provided socio-political ecosystem for rise of heterodox sects against Brahmanical orthodoxy.

3. RISE OF HETERODOX SECTS IN UP

Reason for Rise: Reaction against Varna rigidity, Iron-aided agriculture needing cattle conservation (against Vedic sacrifices), and rise of the merchant class (Vaishyas).

A. BUDDHISM & UTTAR PRADESH (The Cradle)

Significance: Buddha spent most of his ascetic life in UP.

- Sarnath (Varanasi)**
Dhammachakrapravartana (First Sermon). Site of Dhamek Stupa.
- Kushinagar**
Mahaparinirvana (Death) at the Sal tree grove.
- Shrivasti (Bahraich)**
Buddha spent 24 Rainy Seasons (Varshavas) here. Maximum sermons delivered here (Jetavana Monastery).
- Kaushambi**
Ghoshitaram Vihara (visited by Buddha).

B. JAINISM & UTTAR PRADESH

Holy Land: Birthplace of several Tirthankaras.

- Ayodhya**
Birthplace of 5 Tirthankaras, including the first, Rishabhdev (Adinath).
- Varanasi**
Birthplace of Parshvanath (23rd Tirthankara).
- Shrivasti**
Birthplace of Sambhavnath (3rd Tirthankara).
- Mathura**
Became a major center of Jain art (Mathura School) in the post-Mauryan period (Kankali Tila).

4. CURRENT AFFAIRS LINKAGE

SCO Tourism Capital (2023-24): Varanasi (Kashi) was declared the first-ever SCO Cultural & Tourism Capital.

Relevance: Highlights the continuity of Kashi as a living city from the Mahajanapada era to modern diplomacy.

Kushinagar International Airport (Operationalized): Constructed to connect the Buddhist Circuit directly with SE Asian countries.

Impact: Reviving the ancient "Uttarapatha" trade route dynamics through tourism.

Navya Ayodhya Project: While focused on the Ram Temple, the master plan includes the preservation of Tirthankara shrines, acknowledging Ayodhya's status as a Jain heritage city (Kosala Capital legacy).

Shrivasti & Kapilvastu Development: Included in the Swadesh Darshan 2.0 scheme for integrated destination development.

5. UP SPECIFIC POLICY/ECONOMY NOTE

The Buddhist Circuit Policy

Route: Sarnath → Kushinagar → Kapilvastu → Shrivasti → Sankisa → Kaushambi.

Goal: To capture 20% of the global Buddhist tourism market.

Infrastructure: Upcoming Ganga Expressway and Purvanchal Expressway roughly align with the ancient trade routes connecting these Mahajanapadas.

MAURYAN TO GUPTA PERIOD IN UTTAR PRADESH: Political Continuity & Cultural Zenith

1. POLITICAL CONTINUITY & CULTURAL TRANSFORMATION



Political Continuity

From Mauryan centralized bureaucracy to Gupta decentralized feudal structure. UP was the "administrative laboratory" of ancient India.



Cultural Zenith

Transition from Mauryan symbolic art to Mathura's anthropomorphic perfection and Gupta classical temple architecture. Defines UP's contribution to Indian aesthetics.

2. MAURYAN EMPIRE IN UP (322 BCE – 185 BCE)

Topra (Saharanpur, moved to Delhi): Only pillar with all 7 Pillar Edicts.

Meerut (Meerut, moved to Delhi): Transported via Yamuna.

Prayagraj (Kaushambi): Edicts of Ashoka, Samudragupta (Prayag Prashasti), Jahangir.



Key Locations with original sites and features

Sarnath (Varanasi): Lion Capital (National Emblem), Inscription on Sangha schism.

Sohgaura Copper Plate (Gorakhpur): Oldest evidence of famine relief (grain distribution) in India.

Ahraura (Mirzapur): Minor Rock Edict asserting Ashoka's devotion to Buddhism.

3. POST-MAURYAN PERIOD: KUSHAN ERA (c. 1st – 3rd Century CE)



Mathura emerged as Kanishka's second capital.

THE MATHURA SCHOOL OF ART



Material: Spotted Red Sandstone (Sikri/Agra).
Innovation: First human image of Buddha (formerly symbols).
Secularism: Icons for Hinduism, Jainism, Buddhism.

MATHURA SCHOOL (UP)

Influence: Indigenous (Yaksha/Yakshini style)
Material: Spotted Red Sandstone
Buddha's Look: Strong, muscular, shaved head (Kapardin)
Patronage: Kushanas

GANDHARA SCHOOL (NW FRONTIER)

Influence: Hellenistic/Greek influence
Material: Blue-Grey Schist / Stucco
Buddha's Look: Calm, wavy hair, yogic posture (Apollo-like)
Patronage: Kushanas & Shakas



GUPTA PERIOD IN UTTAR PRADESH: THE GOLDEN AGE (c. 319 – 540 CE)



Status: UP was the home province of the Gupta dynasty (Prayag-Saket region).

A. TEMPLE ARCHITECTURE (Nagara Style Beginnings)

Evolution: Transition from rock-cut caves to structural brick/stone temples.

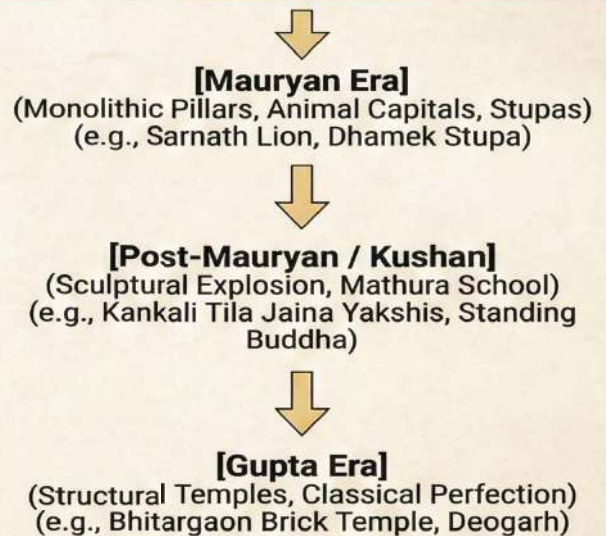

5. CURRENT AFFAIRS LINKAGE



1. **Deogarh Development:** Part of Bundelkhand Tourism Circuit; focus on lighting/conservation of Dashavatara Temple for heritage tourism.



2. **Mathura Refinery & Taj Trapezium Zone (TTZ):** Pollution impacting monuments; 'Mathura Declaration' for heritage preservation.



3. **National Emblem Controversy (2022-23):** Debate on 'aggression' of lions on new Parliament vs. Sarnath original. Reflects changing interpretation of Mauryan art.



4. **Excavations at Hulaskhera (Lucknow):** State Archaeology Dept findings of Gupta-period road and settlement, showing urban planning in central UP.

7. UP SPECIFIC POLICY NOTE



1. **Museum Development:** UP Govt upgrading Government Museum, Mathura to house Kushan-era red sandstone sculptures.



2. **Heritage Arc (Agra-Lucknow-Varanasi):** Sarnath (Mauryan) and Deogarh/Bhitargaon (Gupta) serve as key archaeological nodes feeding into this arc.

1. STRATEGIC CENTRALITY & CULTURAL SYNCRETISM

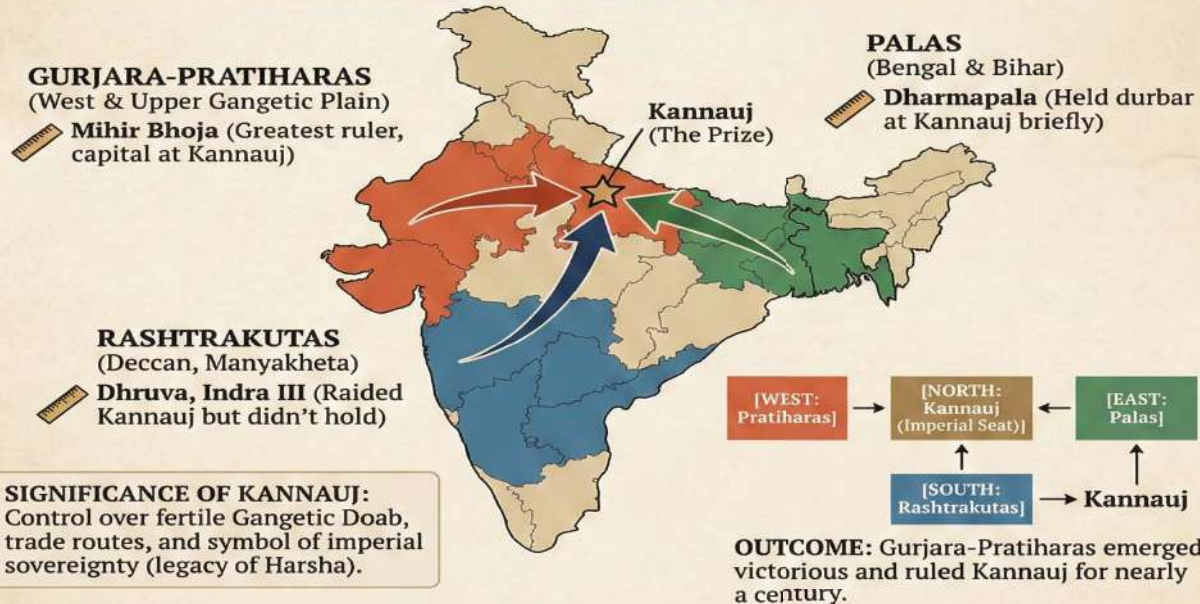


POLITICAL AXIS: Shift of "Imperial Seat" from Pataliputra to Kannauj (Kanyakubja). Ganga-Yamuna Doab becomes the focal point of North Indian politics.



CULTURAL FUSION: Birth of "Ganga-Jamuni Tehzeeb" (Syncretic Culture). Epitomized by Sharqi court of Jaunpur (Shiraz-e-Hind) & Bhakti-Sufi traditions in Varanasi & Awadh.

2. THE KANNAUJ TRIANGLE (TRIPARTITE STRUGGLE) (c. 750 – 1000 CE)



3. SULTANATE PERIOD IN UP: THE SHARQI DYNASTY (JAUNPUR) (1394 – 1479 CE)



- 1 **FOUNDATION (1359):** Jaunpur city founded by Firoz Shah Tughlaq in memory of Muhammad bin Tughlaq (Jauna Khan).
- 2 **DYNASTY FOUNDER (1394):** Malik Sarwar (Malik-us-Sharq/Lord of the East) declared independence from Tughlaqs.
- 3 **GOLDEN ERA (1402–1440):** Reign of Ibrahim Shah Sharqi.

- **EDUCATION:** Jaunpur became a leading center of Islamic theology, logic, and law.
- **CULTURE:** Title "Shiraz-e-Hind" given by Shah Jahan. Birthplace of Ghazal genre in India; emergence of Khayal gayaki.

4. SHARQI ARCHITECTURE (JAUNPUR STYLE)

Distinct Style: Fusion of Tughlaq sturdiness & indigenous Hindu aesthetics.



1. PROPYLON SCREENS: Massive, rectangular pylons with inclined sides in façade center (hiding dome).



2. BATTERING WALLS: Sloping walls (Tughlaq influence).

3. ABSENCE OF MINARETS: Unique characteristic among Islamic styles.

KEY MONUMENTS IN JAUNPUR

Monument	Built By	Key Feature
Atala Masjid 	Ibrahim Shah Sharqi	Built on site of Atala Devi Temple. Model for future Jaunpur mosques.
Lal Darwaza 	Bibi Raji (Queen)	Dedicated to a Sufi Saint. Smaller version of Atala Masjid.
Jama Masjid 	Hussain Shah Sharqi	Largest and last of the Sharqi mosques.
Shahi Bridge 	Akbar (Mughal Era)	Built over Gomti River by Munim Khan. Still functional.

5. CURRENT AFFAIRS LINKAGE



• **Mihir Bhoja Caste Controversy (2021-23):** Statue unveiling in Dadri sparked conflict between Gurjar & Rajput communities over claiming Emperor Mihir Bhoja (Kannauj Pratihara). Significance: Political appropriation of medieval history.



• **Kannauj Perfume Park (ODOP):** UP Govt developing International Perfume Park. Link: Reviving medieval legacy of Kannauj as perfumery capital.



• **Jaunpur Heritage Conservation:** Included in Swadesh Darshan Scheme. Recent ASI restoration at Shahi Qila (Jaunpur Fort) to boost Eastern UP tourism.

MUGHAL ARCHITECTURE IN UP: A STRUCTURAL EVOLUTION

PHASE I: THE AGE OF RED SANDSTONE (Akbar & Jehangir)

Style: Fusion of Persian Arches/Domes with Hindu Trabeate (Lintel/Beam) System



AGRA FORT (Agra)

Started by Akbar (1565)
Jehangiri Mahal: Purely Hindu design (brackets/beams)
 Later additions by Shah Jahan.



FATEHPUR SIKRI (Agra)

Buland Darwaza: Highest Gateway (54m), commemorates Gujarat victory

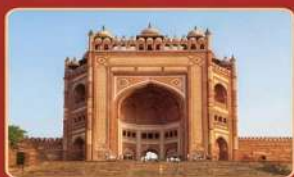

ARCHITECTURE, CULTURE & HERITAGE OF UTTAR PRADESH: ANCIENT FOUNDATIONS



ARCHITECTURAL LABORATORY:

Experimented with transition from timber to stone, caves to structural temples, sandstone to marble.



CULTURAL STRATIGRAPHY:

Living cross-section where Nagara grandeur (Ayodhya), Arcuate finesse (Jaunpur), Indo-Saracenic legacy (Lucknow) coexist.



ECONOMIC ANCHOR:

Heritage is economic backbone. Heritage Arc (Agra-Lucknow-Varanasi) contributes significantly to GSDP; conservation is a fiscal imperative.

ANCIENT ARCHITECTURE (The Foundations): Structural Evolution

MAURYAN ERA (3rd Century BCE): THE SHIFT TO STONE (Revolution under Ashoka: Wood/mud to Chunar Sandstone)

PILLARS (STAMBHAS)

- **Monolithic:** Carved from single stone block.
- **Mauryan Polish:** Distinctive mirror-like gloss.

SARNATH (VARANASI): THE LION CAPITAL



- National Emblem.
- Represents Dhamma chakravartana.
- Abacus features four animals: **Lion, Elephant, Bull, Horse** (phases of Buddha's life).

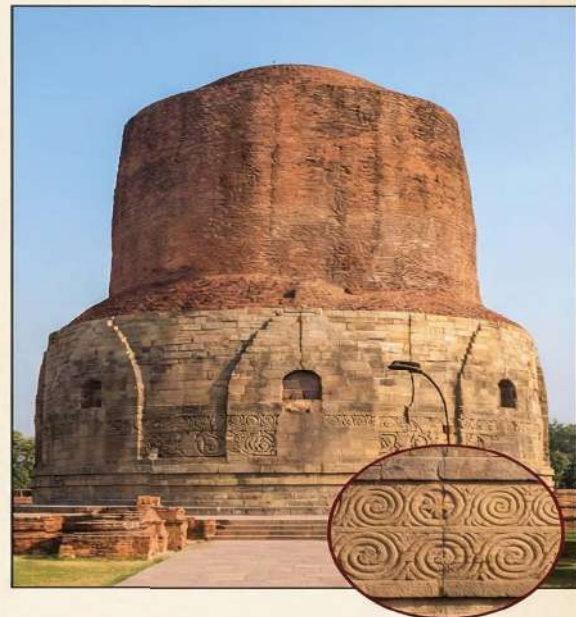


PRAYAGRAJ PILLAR

- Contains edicts of three emperors: **Ashoka** (Peace), **Samudragupta** (Conquest/Prayag Prashasti), **Jahangir** (Genealogy).

STUPAS

DHAMEK STUPA (SARNATH)



- Unlike hemispherical **Sanchi Stupa**, a solid cylindrical tower of brick and stone.
- Marks the spot where **Buddha preached his first sermon**.
- **Architectural Feature:** Use of **geometrical floral patterns (spirals)** on the stone veneer.

GUPTA PERIOD (319 – 540 CE) & BUDDHIST ARCHITECTURE IN UTTAR PRADESH

GUPTA PERIOD: THE GOLDEN AGE & BIRTH OF THE STRUCTURAL TEMPLE

Significance: Transition from rock-cut caves to free-standing, structural temples.

CASE STUDY 1: DASHAVATARA TEMPLE (DEOGARH, LALITPUR)



- **Status:** First Panchayatana style temple in North India.



- **Shikhara:** Earliest evidence of a curvilinear tower (dilapidated).

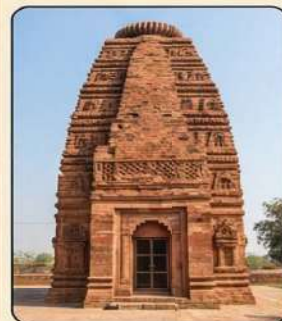


- **Sculpture:** Famous "Sheshashayi Vishnu" reclining on Ananta; zenith of Gupta art.



- **Doorway (Dwar):** Intricate carvings of river goddesses Ganga and Yamuna.

CASE STUDY 2: BHITARGAON TEMPLE (KANPUR)



- **Material:** Entirely built of Brick and Terracotta (due to stone scarcity).



- **Engineering:** Earliest successful use of the True Arch and vault in a Hindu temple.



- **Decoration:** Exterior decorated with terracotta panels depicting Shiva, Vishnu, Makaras.

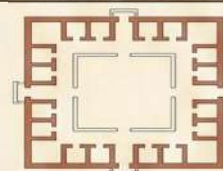
BUDDHIST ARCHITECTURE IN UTTAR PRADESH

KUSHINAGAR (MAHAPARINIRVANA TEMPLE)



- **Reclining Buddha:** 6.1m monolithic red sandstone statue (Gupta period). Modern restoration on ancient plinth.

SHRAVASTI (JETAVANA MONASTERY)



- Excavations reveal planned layout of cells (Viharas) surrounding a central courtyard. A prototype for later monastic architecture.

MEDIEVAL ARCHITECTURE OF UTTAR PRADESH: INDO-ISLAMIC SYNTHESIS

Section B: Medieval Architecture (The Fusion)

The medieval period in UP is defined by the Indo-Islamic synthesis. Two distinct regional schools (Sharqi and Awadhi) emerged alongside the Imperial Mughal style.

1. THE SHARQI STYLE (JAUNPUR): 'SHIRAZ-E-HIND'

Context: Developed under the Sharqi Sultans (14th-15th Century) who declared independence from Delhi.

Distinct Features



The Propylon: Massive, high, battered (sloping) gateway screen concealing the main dome. Hallmark of Jaunpur style.

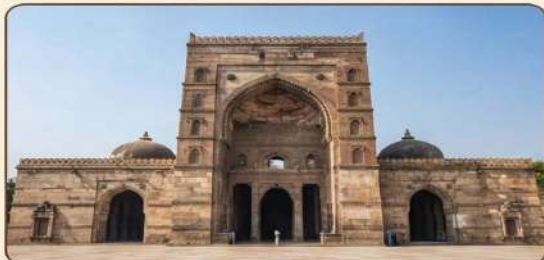


No Minarets: Sharqi mosques generally lack minarets, unlike Mughal mosques.



Bold Character: Described as "strong, sincere, and purposeful" compared to Delhi's delicate ornamentation.

Key Examples



Atala Masjid: Built on the foundations of the Atala Devi temple. The central pylon is 75 feet high.



Jhanjhari Masjid: Famous for its fine screen-work (Jhanjhar means lattice/screen).

2. THE MUGHAL STYLE (AGRA & FATEHPUR SIKRI)

Evolutionary Graph: Red Sandstone (Akbar) → Transition (Jehangir) → White Marble (Shah Jahan)

PHASE I: AKBAR (FATEHPUR SIKRI)

Theme: Synthesis

Akbar deliberately mixed Persian domes with Hindu trabeate (beams/brackets) elements to reflect his Sulh-i-kul policy.



Panch Mahal: A 5-storey open pavilion resembling a Buddhist Vihara.



Buland Darwaza: Highest gateway in India (54m), built to commemorate the victory over Gujarat. Introduces the semi-domed portal (Iwan).

PHASE II: SHAH JAHAN (AGRA)



The Taj Mahal



Concept: Hasht-Bihisht (Eight Paradises) floor plan.



Engineering: Double-dome structure (outer bulbous dome, inner smaller dome) allows for imposing height and acoustic balance inside.



Pietra Dura: Inlay work using semi-precious stones (Lapis Lazuli, Jasper, Jade) into marble.

The Nawabi Innovation with Brick and Lime

MATERIALS & TECHNIQUE

Small, thin, flat bricks. Lacking stone resources, Nawabs innovated with this locally available material.



GARA (MORTAR)
(Specialized Mixture)
A mixture of lentil paste, jaggery, lime, and organic additives for high strength and durability.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES



STUCCO WORK
(Imitating Stone)
Intricate plaster carving to mimic the appearance of carved stone, a hallmark of Awadhi finesse.

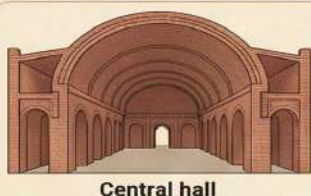

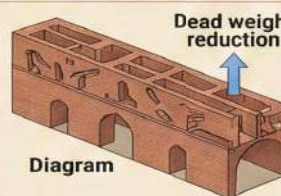

LUCKNOW CHARBAGH RAILWAY STATION (1914)

Designed by J.H. Horniman. Resembles a chessboard from above. Features domes and Rajput-style Chhatris masking a modern steel structure.



ALLAHABAD UNIVERSITY (Vizianagaram Hall)

A perfect blend of Gothic towers and traditional Indian verandahs.

2. GOTHIC REVIVAL



ALL SAINTS CATHEDRAL (PRAYAGRAJ) (Patthar Girja)

Designed by William Emerson. One of the finest examples of 13th-century Gothic style in Asia, featuring stained glass and flying buttresses.

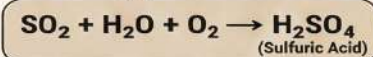
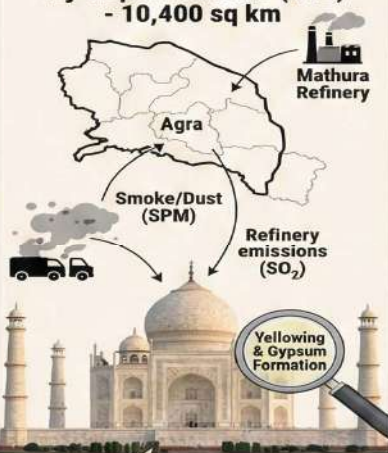

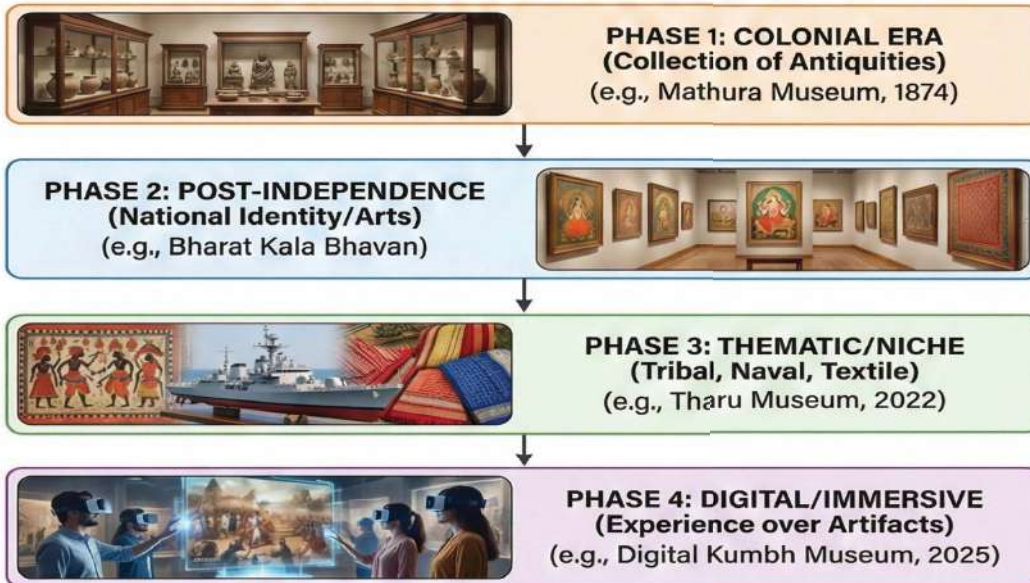

UP offers unbroken stratigraphy: Paleolithic → Neolithic → Chalcolithic → Iron Age, unlike broken stratigraphy of NW India.

3. THE SANAULI PHENOMENON (BRONZE AGE WARRIORS)

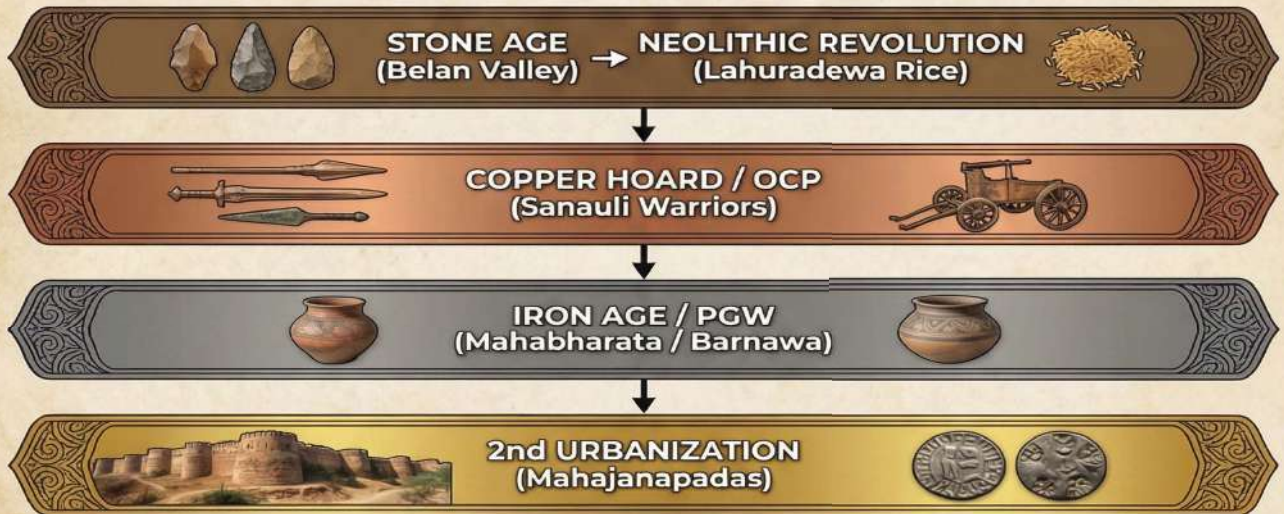

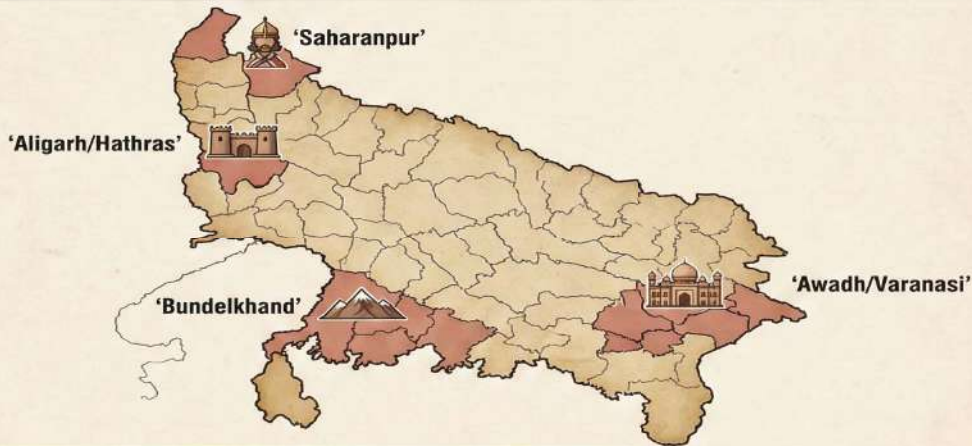

THE REVOLT OF 1857 IN UTTAR PRADESH: A GENERAL CIVIL REBELLION



LUCKNOW (AWADH)
Center of Civil-Military Fusion. Begum Hazrat Mahal led the resistance, declaring her son Birjis Qadir as Nawab. Supported by peasants and talukdars.



KANPUR
Led by Nana Saheb (Peshwa). Seized Kanpur, declared himself Peshwa, and recognized Bahadur Shah Zafar as Emperor.



JHANSI
Rani Lakshmi Bai fought against the Doctrine of Lapse. Her valiant defense became legendary. "Khoob Ladi Mardani, Woh To Jhansi Wali Rani Thi".



BAREILLY (ROHILKHAND)
Khan Bahadur Khan (descendant of Rohilla chief) took command. Established an independent government and organized a force.

- **Attacks:** Targeted British communication lines, police stations, and revenue offices.
- **Gurjar Community:** Played a pivotal role in challenging British authority.

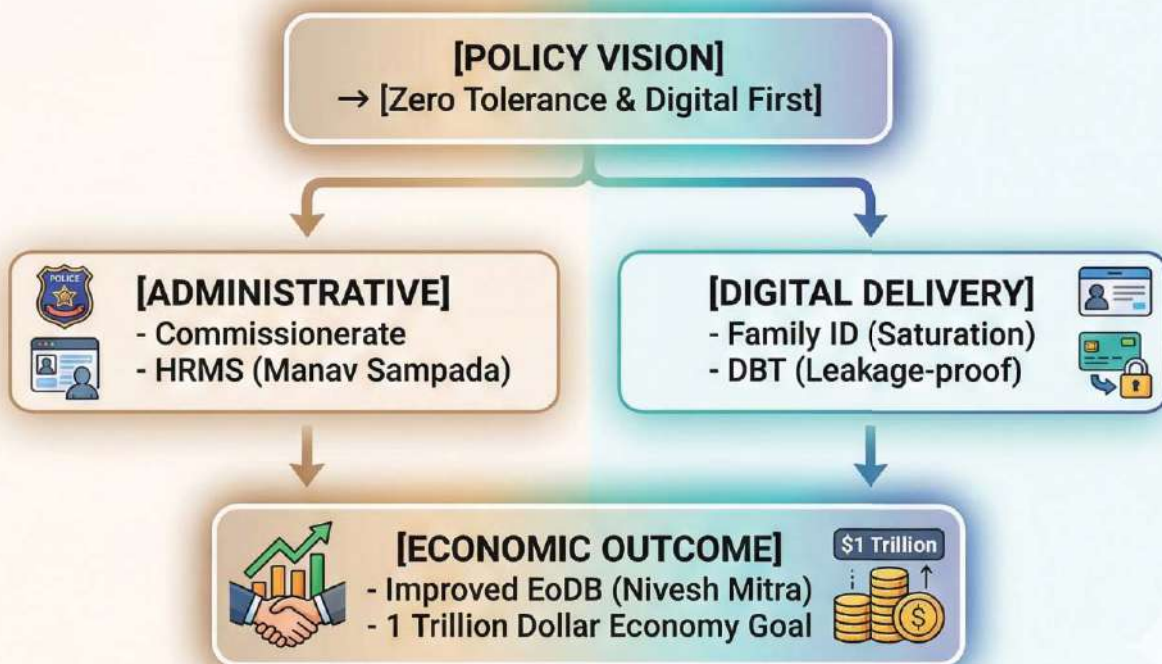

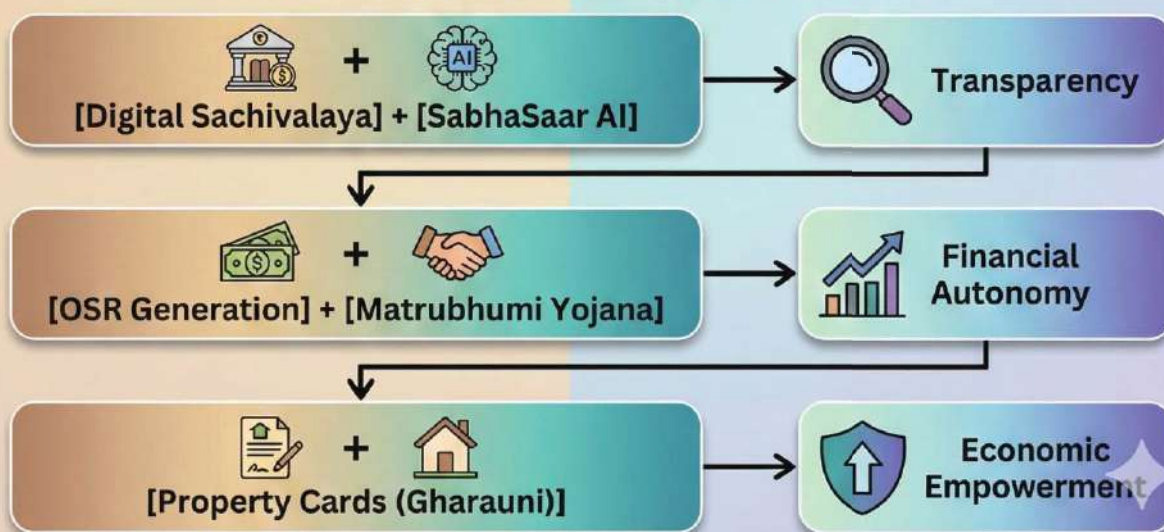

SCHEMATIC: THE RTI LIFE CYCLE IN UP



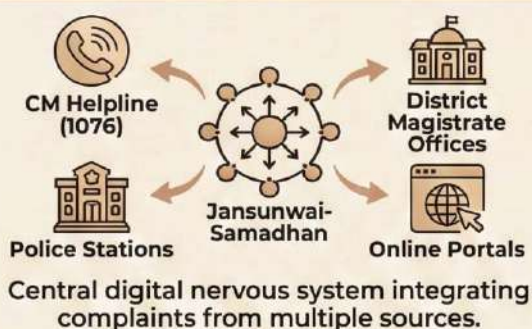

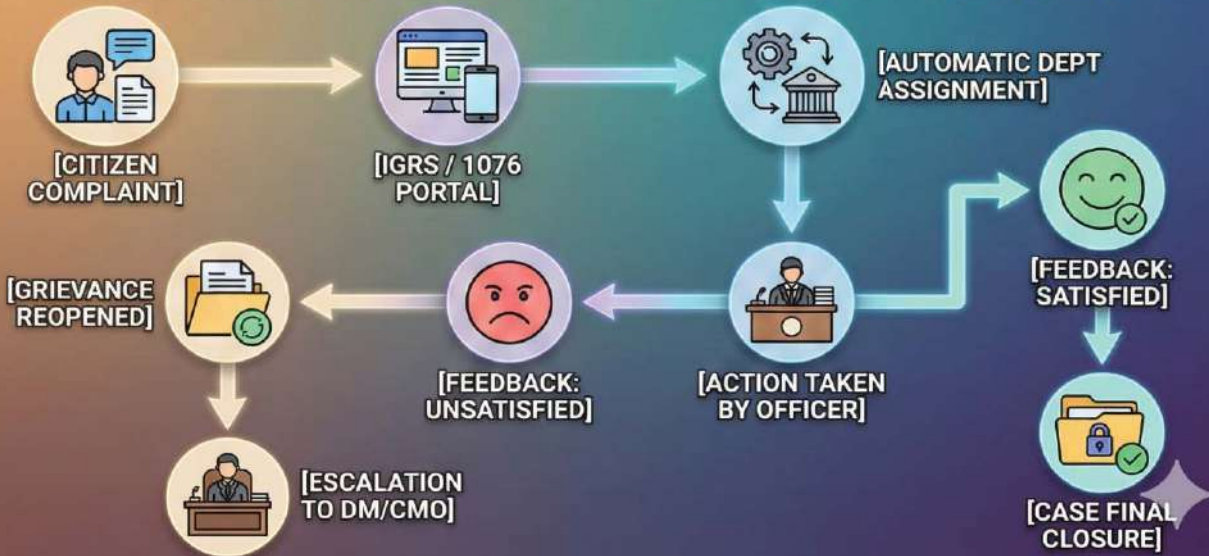

A. HISTORICAL FRAMEWORK (THE THREE PILLARS)



1. UP ZAMINDARI ABOLITION & LAND REFORMS ACT, 1950

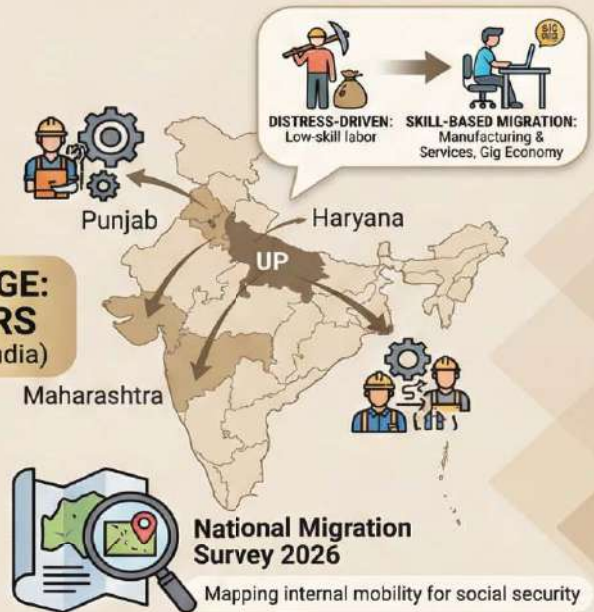

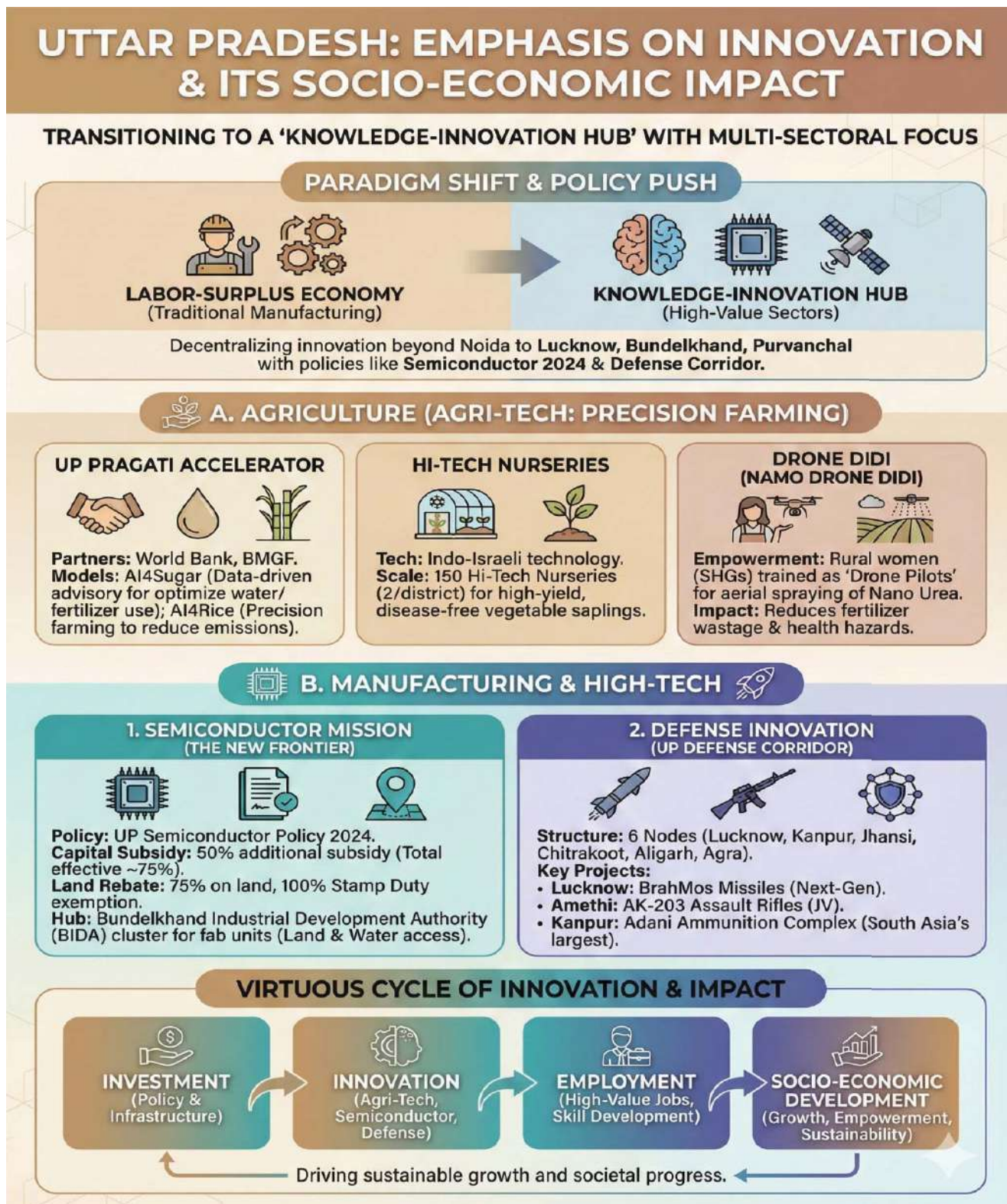
