SOCIAL JUSTICE IS NOT CHARITY.
IT IS STRUCTURAL REBALANCING

Man is born free and yet everywhere he is in chains, said Rousseau. This is especially true for them who form lowest rung of any structural hierarchy. Take the case of Dalits of India, for more than a millenia they have been subdued. By mid of twentieth

century, their conditions become so deplorable that a violent schism in Indian society and polity was inevitable. Had our intelligent forefathers not provided social justice in form of reservation, perhaps our society and nation as a whole might have ruptured.

Hence social justice is not a charity, but a necessity, a practicality to maintain harmony by re rebalancing the existing structure - which might be oppressive to some. Every life has sanctity, each one of us deserve a dignified life, given a base level opportunity, every child can be shine like a star - be it black or white, male or female, Dalit or Brahman, poor or rich, anyone. Therefore it is an onus upon government and we as a

society to give social justice to marginalised so that there is harmony.

This essay is a humble attempt to understand the same. But before delving deeper let us first see how social structure emerges and how it can be harsh to some.

Marxist ~~structure~~ scholars says structure is a product of capitalist class to maintain status quo. While feminist scholars say, structure is product of men to subdue women. Till World War II it was accepted that social structure is functional that is necessary to maintain balance by binding people into specific status and role. The domination of one in the top of hierarchy was normalised and given scholarly backing.

But as technology grew, as education and awareness spread, each of above hypothesis was challenged. Civil Rights Movement erupted, caste movement took up shape, feminist movement bludgeoned. Social structure truly had been in favour of privileged one. Had it not been subalanced from the efforts of above movement, perhaps there could have been violent uprising and deep faultline in society. Hence social justice is not ^{just} charity, but a necessity for peaceful world society.

Now, let us look a bit deeper into how

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social justice is essential.
 Besides, ^{By} providing, opportunities to marginalised (equity), social justice lowers the gap between groups. Hence, it is a precondition to increased communication and collaboration between different groups. Only through this fraternity can be fostered in true spirit among Indians and this exactly has been the dream of Dr. Ambedkar.

Moreover, as marginalised become empowered through social justice, they increasingly start participating in governance. This ensures a more inclusive policy-making, a more inclusive and diverse viewpoints which result in a vibrant democracy, a democracy in true spirit.

And the foremost of all, as inequality decreases through structural rebalancing, there is creation of social capital as well. Empowered People from every nook and corner participate in functioning of society, solve their problem together and facilitate a participatory governance.

Thus we can say social justice is a prerequisite for an inclusive, functional and vibrant society and nation.

Our wise lawmakers, time and again has tried to ensure social justice through a plethora of laws. For instance, in constitution Article 15(3), 15(4) and 15(5) ensures educational access in higher institution to marginalized, in the same spirit Article 16(4), 16(5) and 16(6) ensures representation of

minimized marginalized in public services.

Gender justice has also been taking shape through laws like representation in PRIs, reservation in Lok Sabha and state legislature (106th amendment), better healthcare facility (Matru Vandana Yojana etc). Besides, People with Disabilities Act has been a stepping stone to bring the disabled people (divyang) into the mainstream.

Also, the ignored old population are now being provided justice through better geriatric care, pension schemes, introduction of silver economy etc. Overall, social justice is a wisdom, to include everyone each member of society, to

harness potential of every member for the betterment of society and growth of nation as a whole.

One may ask then, is everything roses with social justice, is there no thorns? Well, social justice has some cost at beginning like maintaining a balance between justice and meritocracy and efficiency. But in long run as people get empowered efficiency of system is well taken care of.

The problem comes, when the political classes uses the method of social justice ~~to~~ for their benefits. These can be seen during in

When populist policies get out of the line, when providing reservation to dominant groups for ensuring vote bank has no basis - in all these scenarios social justice changes into social adventurism. These ~~set~~ steps set up the wrong precedents and can cause a havoc in the long run.

And that's why our wise judiciary has come up with some checks. For instance, Indira Sawhney judgement caps off reservation limit to 50%. Judgement in M. Chinniah case ensures government to provide material basis for promotion in reservation so that accountability prevails over populism. Therefore,

social justice alongwith prudence, right intention only can rebalance the structure or else it will just reverse the scenario which is equally dangerous.

The importance of social justice is once again growing in our society, nation and world. Today, the intense capitalism has resulted in mushrooming of wealth. Top 1% population occupy 41% wealth in India. This has is again increasing the faultline between rich and poor.

Although women have been ~~a~~ provided with number of schemes, yet their conditions has stagnated. The glass ceiling

the pink collar jobs have restricted their rise to equality. Moreover, in leadership positions and in top institutions people from marginalized communities like SC + ST are seen as exotic (meagre in numbers).

Land alienation, relocation without rehabilitation due to developmental projects is becoming rampant in tribes.

These all can become a bottleneck to our glorious growth trajectory. These can cause our demographic dividend turn into demographic disaster. Fraternity can once again be replaced with rising communalism, separatism, regionalism.

etc. for how can a bird fly if its one wing is well and other malnourished.

And in all these scenarios, the above topic becomes all the more important. It suggests, social justice is -

not populism, but practicalism
not a violation of equality,
but a vehicle of equality
not a charity but necessity.

If carried with right intent and spirit, social justice can once again put our society into a place where everyone is free, where every head is held high.
