why Vivekananda has said -

Therefore, India is necessarily a pluralistic society - its most ancient identity and its greatest strengths

But, is it all roses and no thorns! Because theories like Ethnic Boundary by Fredrik Barth suggest - when two groups or ethnic people live side by side there is an inherent tension. Cliffortz Greentz says in such scenario there is a longer period of uncomfortable peace and sudden eruption of violence destroying pluralistic fibre.

Is this also true

In case of India because here multiple groups live in pluralistic society?

Partially Yes! The communal riot of 1947 or current cases like Muzaffarnagar riot, Delhi riot 2020, Anti-Sikh riot of 1984 are testament to this fact. Moreover, violence against marginalized groups like Dalits in form of mob lynching, cow vigilantism is on rise.

veer the Bharatwar"


that means be it a Gurkhas

What a shame! Can we be truly proud of our <sup>v</sup> scientific genius in such ethically numbing scenarios? Perhaps we are, because our wisdom has stalled and taken a backseat. But let us see first why it is so, why science is gathering knowledge at a lightening pace and behind it the infant of societal wisdom is still crawling.

Some of it can be attributed to our evolution where our brain grew disproportionately outshining all its brethren - the primates. But necessarily our needs remain the same - survival, competition of resources, spaces etc. And in these scenarios competition is still overpowering collaboration, our own selfish need is still getting prioritized over ethics and welfare of all and narrow groupism, nationalism is still taking precedent over universalism.

Moreover, there are orthodox factors in our society like religion, people in power who want to maintain the status quo. Therefore, there

develops a great gap between science and morality, tech, technology and culture which social scholars give the term of Cultural lag.

is identifying a black American with enhanced probability of being a criminal and a blind people is unable to reap the benefit of most of the apps.

Moreover, there has been rise of techno nationalism where technically sound country is not sharing tech with disadvantaged one widening the present gap. And even more sadly, colonialism has taken a new Avatar of Technocolonialism where African countries are once again being entrapped, debt-trapped and being used as a product for one's own economic gain.

Sadly, this make us all think where the future of

humanity is going? Can technology  
will always be the frankenstein  
monsters which will devour us?  
Or can ~~the~~ knowledge of science  
walk in hand in hand with  
wisdom?

An emphatic yes! There  
is no dearth of cases where  
knowledge of science fuelled our  
wisdom. Be it biotechnology  
which is making us wiser by  
using our resources wisely along  
with ensuring food or nutritional  
security. Or be it Artificial  
intelligence which is helping  
in precision agriculture, decoding  
our gene and thus save ourselves  
from life threatening diseases.

Science and wisdom

can also go together in governance where app like MyGov can foster participatory governance, Grievance Redressal etc.

Therefore, let us use ~~tech~~ knowledge of science to empower us and not disempower. Let us use technology to give more autonomy and dignity to people rather than just using them as a tool of advancement. Let the brightness of technology not blind and burn us but rather illuminate our ignorance and fuel our wisdom. for -

“Technology can be an obedient <sup>servant</sup> but a cruel master”

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
