2. **CD & VA = Content Density & Value Addition.** Examiner will evaluate the quality and quantity of your content in the answer. In the same word limit and space limit have you (a) written what is asked (b) gone beyond what is asked (c) enriched answers through combination of (but not all!) suggestions, ideas, quotes, flowcharts, diagrams, facts and figures, data etc. This affects objective components of assessment.
3. **S & F = Structure & Flow =** Whether you have structured your answer properly or not. Whether the answer has been broken into parts and sub-parts and each part has been addressed appropriately or not. Whether the flow of the answer is maintained. Affects both subjective and objective components of assessment.
4. **P & R =** How your answer performs on the criteria of presentation, ease of read, clarity and apparent effort in writing the answer. This affects the subjective components of assessment.

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

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

- ③ Operation Kayakalp :- to modernise school infrastructure



Uttar Pradesh has around 20 lakh registered NGOs adding in state growth. However, there are certain challenges faced by them.

Challenges faced by NGOs in Uttar Pradesh

- ① Data gap: absence of data leads to poor decision
 eg. Migrants data
- ② Regulatory hurdle: overregulation leads to obstructions in NGO functioning
 eg. Roids in NGOs
- ③ FCRA Norms: Acting as continuous surveillance hindering autonomous functioning

④ Political influence :- Political pressure leading to non-efficient functioning

(eg) Exposing corruption

⑤ Funding constraint :- lack of funds obstructs functioning

(eg) Monitoring our finances

⑥ Allegations of anti-government :- allegations that some NGOs work against government

(eg) Amnesty

⑦ License cancellations :- If working hinders government projects

Ways to resolve challenges

① Transparent functioning :- to avoid any accusations

② Accountability :- Compliance with laws and PCRA norms

to ensure accountability

(eg) Seva Mandir NGO

③ Coordination with government & to implement government schemes

(eg) Ashray Patra Foundation is Lucknow

④ Evidence based policy :- Data collection to ensure effective functioning

⑤ Community confidence & engaging community to gain confidence

(eg) Dhruva NGO

⑥ Voluntary disclosure of funding sources to avoid undue criticisms

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

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

Healthcare challenges of state

- ① Infrastructure lag, poor Doctor to patient ratio
(eg) 1:3240 (NITI Aayog)
- ② Non functioning facilities :- poor conditions of PHCs
(eg) 50% PHCs non functioning
- ③ High Maternal Mortality Rate :- More than the national average



- ④ Poor bed availability :- In hospitals due to shortage of infrastructure
 (eg) Covid period
- ⑤ Out of pocket expenditure :-
 Pressure on people's pocket
 (eg) Out of pocket expenditure = 50%.


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
